"Hurts So... Good! - Management of Acute Dental Pain and Appropriate Opioid Prescribing"



Management of acute odontogenic pain is accomplished through a clinical approach that successfully incorporates both opioid and non-opioid analgesics. However, moderate to severe dental pain often occurs well after office hours and away from our immediate supervision. Thus, it is critical for clinicians to be able to accurately identify a patient's need for pain control, develop an individualized pain management plan, and assess the efficacy of analgesic agents employed. This program will provide strategies for effectively managing dental pain with opioid and non-opioid analgesics and analgesic adjuvants, while also mitigating associated risks. Special emphasis will be given to appropriate practices for prescribing analgesics as well as identification and treatment of opioid analgesic abuse.

"Periodontal regeneration- updated"



Major advances in periodontal therapy have resulted in paradigm shifts in the periodontal field. Over the last decade, there was realization that the periodontal structures can be regenerated, rather than simply repairing the tissue after periodontal disease has occurred. How do we recognize and screen patients for the appropriate therapies? When should clinicians intervene?

This course will review the diagnosis, etiology and treatment options of the bony defects around teeth. Biological principles of periodontal regeneration, clinical application of tissue regeneration, and the regenerative materials will be discussed.

"Importance of Early Detection of Aggressive Periodontitis in Children"



One out of every 100 children exhibit localized aggressive periodontitis, formerly known as juvenile periodontitis, in America. It is a rare but debilitating periodontal disease in children that can have a lifelong impact on their oral health and function. The bone loss pattern around incisors and molars can be detected as early as in primary dentition and ultimately affect the permanent dentition that follows. Recognizing risk factors and working with periodontists and physicians in a timely manner can prevent our young patients from extensive dental treatment and loss of dentition in the future. The goal of this presentation is to understand the epidemiology, risk factors, diagnosis and treatment for young patients with rapidly progressing periodontitis in incisor/molar pattern.
